
#### Why teamwork is important to you









The Learning Continuum pre-licensure through practice trajectory

Create partnerships where educators and practice leaders *work together* to apply interprofessional collaboration and leadership principles to prepare practice teams to succeed in a changing healthcare environment



# How it all comes together...

Interprofessional education teaches us <u>HOW</u> to be <u>collaborative practice ready</u> so we can practice <u>team-based</u> <u>care.</u>

<u>Team based care</u> is the provision of health services to individuals, families, and/or their communities by at least two health providers who work collaboratively with patients and their caregivers-to the extent preferred by each patientto accomplish shared goals within and across settings to achieve coordinated, high-quality care."







# This requires new ways of thinking...

#### The old way of diabetes management:

Schedule patients for primary care or endocrinology 3-4 times a year


And we see them only when they come to the office

15 minute visits, usually provider led

Treat complications as they occur

Reimbursed on a fee for service basis








# The 'new' way

Engage with individuals and family members frequently through email, phone, MyChart

- Appointments with the whole team—physician, nurses, nutrition, behavioral health, life coaches, community health workers, public health and community resources
- Contact patients who we do not hear from
- Goal is to prevent complications
- WE get reimbursed if we prevent them from getting 'sicker'


